1.	Himalayan Toad	<i>Bufo himalayanus</i> (Günther, 1864)	Not evaluated	In Pakistan it has been recorded from Azad Kashmir, Hazara Division, and Northwestern Frontier Province.
2.	Ladakh Toad	<i>Bufo latastii</i>	Not evaluated	Ladakh in Baltistan between 2600 to 3000 m of elevation.
3.	Southeast Asian Toad	<i>Bufo melanostictus</i>	Not evaluated	in Pakistan, this toad is confined to District Hazara, Northwestern Frontier Province, Alpine Punjab and Azad Kashmir (Mertens, 1969a; Khan, 1972a).
4.	Hazara Toad	<i>Bufo melanostictus hazarensis</i>	Not evaluated	northern Pakistan
5	Olive Toad	<i>Bufo olivaceus</i>	Not evaluated	<i>Bufo olivaceus</i> is recorded from the extreme western parts of Balochistan and adjoining Iran.
6	Swat Green Toad	<i>Bufo pseudoraddei pseudoraddei</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information
7.	Batura glacier Toad	<i>Bufo pseudoraddei baturae</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information

14	Common Skittering Frog	<i>Euphlyctis cyanophlyctis cyanophlyctis</i>	Not evaluated	The frog is remarkably capable of adjusting itself to the uncertain aquatic conditions in temperate arid parts of Pakistan. Recently Khan (1997) described a spinulate race <i>E. c. microspinulata</i> of this frog from northwestern tableland of Hindukush and Balochistan.
15	Spiny skittering frog	<i>Euphlyctis cyanophlyctis microspinulata</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information
16	Seistan Skittering Frog	<i>Euphlyctis cyanophlyctis seistanica</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information
17	Indus Valley Bullfrog	<i>Holobatrachus tigerinus</i>	Not evaluated	In Pakistan it does not extend into Balochistan, however it has been reported from Afghanistan close to Khyber Pass.
18	Alpine Cricket Frog	<i>Fejervarya limnocharis</i>	Not evaluated	<i>Limnonectes limnocharis</i> is most common and widely distributed species in the waters of neighboring Azad Kashmir. Common in peddy fields and wetlands in the upper Indus Valley. This species is mainly distributed in the sub-Himalayan parts of Pakistan
19	Southern Cricket Frog	<i>Fejervarya syhadrensis</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information
20	Tibetan Frog	<i>Nanorana pleskei</i>	Near Threaten In IUCN red list its distribution is only in (China)	In Pakistan it does not extend into Balochistan, however it has been reported from Afghanistan close to Khyber Pass.
21	Kashmir Torrent Frog	<i>Paa barmoachensis</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information

22	Hazara Torrent Frog	<i>Paa hazarensis</i>	Not evaluated	This frog is known from torrents in the Rush Valley in Hazara Division, NWFP, Pakistan.
23	Karez Frog	<i>Paa sternosignata</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information
24	Murree Hills Frog	<i>Paa vicina</i>	Not evaluated	No detailed information
25	Burrowing frog	<i>Sphaerotheca breviceps</i>	Not evaluated	Along the Himalayan foothills in the northwest. It has spotty distribution in the riparian system of Punjab (Khan 1976). Its colonies have been reported in desolate parts of the Cholistan Desert (Khan 1985a). Around Karachi, it is collected from the Hab and Malir River Valleys (Minton 1962, 1966). www.wildlifeofpakistan
